HISTORY

The first curling rocks were thrown at the Richmond Curling Club (RCC) in 1960. The Club has been one of the most active in Eastern Ontario ever since.

RCC's first home was the agricultural society's 4-H calf building, which was converted into a two-sheet curling rink for the winter. Fifty members eagerly signed up in the club's first year. Only five had ever curled before.

The natural ice surface provided some unique challenges, but by 1962, an ice plant had been installed and artificial ice allowed for a longer playing season. The original building was renovated several times, to add a lounge, viewing area, kitchen and clubroom. By 1978, the club had outgrown its home, and plans were launched for a new four-sheet facility. RCC members got busy fundraising, and, with the aid of government grants, the new building was officially opened on Nov. 8, 1980.

The club now boasts a membership of approximately 500 and offers daytime, evening, youth and learn to curl leagues.

PROGRAMS AVAILABLE

The Club offers recreational and competitive daytime and evening curling for adults of all age groups and skill levels:

- Recreational curling Monday through Friday
- Competitive curling Tuesday and Thursday
- Drop-in curling Tuesday mornings followed by lunch and cards
- Ladies' curling Monday and Wednesday evening and Friday afternoon
- Men's curling Wednesday evening
- Social curling on Friday evening and Sunday
- A vibrant, progressive Youth Curling Program
 - Bantam/Junior, ages 13-20
 Mondays 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. 8-12
 - Light Rocks, ages 8- Tuesdays
 4:30 to 6 p.m.

A Learn to Curl Program is held on Sunday mornings from October to December.

Clinics are offered at the Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced levels and for those using a "stick."

OUR CLUB

RCC is a community-oriented, nonprofit organization with members from Richmond, Stittsville, Kanata and surrounding areas. The club offers a friendly, welcoming atmosphere.

A volunteer Board of Directors manages the club. The Board deals with advertising and sponsorship, facilities and ice maintenance, draw scheduling, finance, membership, social events, bar and kitchen.

An annual general meeting is held each June and all members are invited to attend to hear reports on the year's activities and elect the next year's Board oif Directors.

SOCIAL EVENTS

A social membership is offered for those who do not curl, but wish to participate in the social activities of the club. A number of social events are held throughout the year, including a golf tournaments during the summer months
